## Description

Scientific Name Duranta erecta

Family Verbenaceae (Teak)

Native Range Central America, Cuba, Turks and Caicos, The Bahamas

Height at Maturity 3-6m

Time to Maturity 3-4 years

Flowering Period April - June

**Light Preference** Full sun - Partial shade

Soil Preference Rich, organic, loamy and well-drained

Location Preference Adaptable to most areas



Plant Type Shrub

Foliage Evergreen

### **Care Tips**

#### Water (Frequency):

Water plant once per day. During the dry season, it is recommended that the plant is watered in the morning.

#### Pruning (Frequency):

Prune to remove damaged, dead or diseased branches from the base of the shrub. If grown as a hedge, prune to maintain a desirable shape and size.

#### Common Pests and Treatments:

In case of an attack by whiteflies:

 Cut off damaged leaves to prevent infestation of the plant.

#### Infestation

- Treat with Actara or Engeo (insecticides).
   Be guided by manufacturers' directions for use.
- DIY: Spray with a mixture of 1 tablespoon vinegar, 1 tablespoon cooking oil, 1 tablespoon baking soda, 1 tablespoon dishwashing liquid and a piece of scotch bonnet pepper in 1 gallon of water.
- Spray the plant with the solution every 3 days for 11 days.

 Reapply mixture over the same timeline if the pests remain or return after treatment.

### <u>Uses</u>

 Usually planted in pots and along fences for hedging.



 Blossoms attract pollinators including bees, butterflies and hummigbirds.
